

Case Histories with Herbal Formulas Part 2

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1. Leg Qi syndrome

A 19 year old female slept outside in the summer. The following day she experienced weakness and numbness of the legs. A few days later, the weakness was so pronounced that she is only able to walk a few steps at a time. She also has edema on the lower legs. Her symptoms are so severe that she has been unable to get up without help for half a month. There has been no Western diagnosis. Her tongue is purple with a moist, white coating and her pulse is floating and choppy.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and blood stagnation with wind damp bi pain
Spleen and Kidney Qi deficiency.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Promote blood circulation, expel wind dampness and strengthen Qi.

FORMULA:

Huo Lou Xiao Ling Dan modified:

Dang Gui, Chuan Xiong, Ru Xiang, Mo Yao, Dan Shen, Niu Xi and Tu Bei Chong promote blood circulation. Dang Gui nourishes the blood. Chuan Xiong moves Qi in the blood. Ru Xiang and Mo Yao stop pain and promote healing. Ru Xiang is stronger at penetrating through stagnation. Mo Yao is stable and stays in the bloodstream longer. Dan Shen circulates blood in the peripheral veins. Niu Xi promotes urination, descends blood and expels wind damp bi pain. Tu Bei Chong breaks congealed blood and stops pain.

Mu Gua and Yi Yi Ren treat weakness and swelling of the lower extremities. Mu Gua harmonizes the Middle Jiao and Yi Yi Ren drains dampness.

RESOLUTION:

After taking three bags for three days, she reported that her strength was 50% improved and there is no more edema in her legs. The dosage of Dang Gui was increased to 30g and Chuan Xiong was increased to 15g. After thirty days on this formula, she was back to normal.

2. Overstimulation of Liver 13

A 34 year old female came in complaining of sudden fear and palpitations. She also had insomnia, diarrhea and low appetite. She said that the symptoms arose after a friend strongly pressed LV-13. Her tongue is slightly dark with a white coating and her pulse is wiry and slippery.

Note: LV-13 (Liver 13, Zhangmen, Completion Gate) is located directly anterior and inferior to the free end of the 11th rib. It is the Front Mu of the Spleen, Meeting point of the Zang, and Meeting point of the Liver and Gallbladder channels. Transverse or oblique needling medially or laterally prevents damage to the liver or spleen which are located under this acupoint.

DIAGNOSIS:

Liver Qi and Blood stagnation.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Promote Qi and blood circulation.

FORMULA:

Shao Lin Formula for Injury to LV-13

Sheng Di Huang and Hei Zhi Ma nourish Yin and Jing. Sheng Di Huang is cooling to balance the warm herbs. Hei Zhi Ma strengthens Kidney Jing and moistens the intestines.

Hong Hua, Chi Shao, Ru Xiang, Mo Yao and Zi Ran Tong promote blood circulation. Hong Hua breaks congealed Blood. Chi Shao cools the blood. Ru Xiang and Mo Yao break congealed blood, stop bleeding and stop pain. Ru Xiang is stronger at penetrating to the interior. Mo Yao is stable and is maintained in the bloodstream longer. Zi Ran Tong breaks stasis and promotes healing of bones and sinews.

Qing Pi, Chai Hu, Wu Yao, Bing Lang and Yu Jin regulate Qi. Qing Pi breaks Liver Qi stagnation with pain. Chai Hu smooths and opens the Liver Qi. Wu Yao is warming and drying and also benefits the Liver and Kidney. Bing Lang breaks Qi stagnation and promotes urination. Yu Jin promotes blood circulation, cools the blood and opens the orifices.

RESOLUTION:

She took six bags for six days and reported that she no longer has palpitations, diarrhea and insomnia. During the six days, she massaged SP-6 and a line from LI-4 to TB-5 to regulate the Qi.

3. Sudden loss of hair

A 42 year old male woke up in the morning and found a perfect 3-5 cm circle on the scalp without any hair. There is no sensation of itchiness. He explained that he was stressed from

taking care of his father-in-law and flying back and forth across the country. He said that he needs more sleep and more money. His tongue is red with a thin, white coating and his pulse is wiry and floating.

DIAGNOSIS:

Kidney and Liver deficiency with deficiency heat burning the scalp

TREATMENT:

Nourish Kidney Jing, Benefit the Liver, and promote Blood and Qi circulation

FORMULA:

Er Zhi Wan and Tao Hong Si Wu Tang modification

Nu Zhen Zi, Han Lian Cao, Sang Shen Zi, He Shou Wu, Tu Si Zi and Shu Di Huang nourish the Yin. Nu Zhen Zi and Han Lian Cao nourish the Kidney Yin and Jing. Nu Zhen Zi is stronger at nourishing on a deeper level such that its effects are maintained in the bloodstream longer. Han Lian Cao works at a lighter level and is therefore faster acting. Sang Shen Zi nourishes Liver Blood and Kidney Jing while cooling heat. He Shou Wu especially treats hair loss. Tu Si Zi nourishes Kidney Jing and strengthens Kidney Yang. Shu Di Huang is strong and stable which allows it to nourish Blood and Jing.

Hong Hua and Chuan Xiong's light weight allow it to bring Qi and Blood flow to the surface of the scalp. The light weight aspect is the physical characteristic of the herb itself and is reflected in its function and action. Hong Hua breaks Blood stagnation. Chuan Xiong moves the Qi in the blood.

RESOLUTION:

He took three bags for three days after which a few small hairs started to grow. He was instructed to also apply fresh ginger topically to the area once or twice a day. He was unsatisfied with the results and was asked to continue the treatment for 20-30 days. At that time, the patient's hair began to regrow in the bald region.

4. Kidney stones

A 50 year old male patient has lower back pain that is perceived to come "in waves" as described by the patient. He is also urinating blood. He has been given the Western diagnosis of kidney stones. His tongue has a greasy yellow coating and his pulse is deep, wiry and strong.

DIAGNOSIS:

Kidney stones with damp heat in the Lower Jiao

TREATMENT PLAN: D

Dissolve Kidney stones and eliminate damp heat

FORMULA:

Three Jin Two Shi Amber Tang

All the herbs in this group promote urination. Jin Qian Cao dissolves and pushes Kidney stones outwards from the body. Hai Jin Sha promotes urination to release Kidney stones. Ji Nei Jin dissolves stones and strengthens the Kidney. Bei Xie clears turbid, cloudy urination. Dan Zhu Yu sedates Heart fire. Hua Shi is slippery which helps pass Kidney stones. Shi Wei pushes out stones, stops bleeding and clears damp heat.

Sang Zhi clears heat and treats wind damp bi pain in the urinary tract. Wang Bu Liu Xin and Lu Lu Tong promote blood circulation and move stones outward from the body. Wang Bu Liu Xin is more physically dense and therefore maintains its effects in the bloodstream longer. Lu Lu Tong is faster acting as reflected in its physical characteristic of being light weight. Niu Xi promotes blood circulation and urination and descends blood to push stones outwards.

RESOLUTION:

He took two bags for two days. On the morning of the second day, he felt a sudden blockage in the right groin area and was unable to urinate. He continued to try to urinate and was able to push the stone out. There was immediate relief in symptoms when the stone was released. He continued to drink the herbs for one more day.

5. Hydrocele Testis

A 6 year old boy has a swollen left testicle. He has been given the Western diagnosis of hydrocele testis. His tongue is red and his pulse is slippery. He has taken herbs Li Zhi He (Semen Litchi Chianensis), Ju He (Semen Citri Reticulatae), and Xiao Hui Xiang (Fructus Foeniculi Vulgaris) with no effect. Hydrocele testis is the accumulation of fluids around the testicle.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and Phlegm stagnation in the Liver and Kidney channels.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Promote Qi and urination and warm the Liver and Kidney channels.

FORMULA:

Wu Ling San modification:

All the herbs in this group promote urination. Ze Xie sedates Kidney fire. Zhu Ling and Fu Ling are similar but have subtle differences. Zhu Ling is stronger than Fu Ling at cooling heat. Fu Ling is neutral and balances the water metabolism in the body. Yi Yi Ren is draining and is able to travel to the surface and hidden places that other herbs have difficulty reaching. Mu Tong and Dan Zhu Ye drain Heart and Small Intestine fire. Mu Tong strongly promotes urination and breaks stagnation. Dan Zhu Ye sedates Heart fire and drains Upper Jiao damp heat.

Xiao Hui Xiang travels to the surface and moves faster. Wu Zhu Yu is dense and its actions tend to work on the interior.

RESOLUTION:

After taking two bags for two days, the swelling had a 50% improvement. After seven more bags of this formula, the boy is back to normal. The first formula did not work because it was made up of Qi regulating herbs. This case was due to water stagnation more than Qi stagnation.

6. Breast nodule, Case A

A 65 year old male patient came in with coronary artery disease. His symptoms include vertigo and shortness of breath that has worsened in the past 3 months. He found an egg-sized hard nodule in his right breast. He had it checked by an MD and it was found to be a non-cancerous tumor. His tongue is dark red with purple spots on the side with a greasy yellow coating. His pulse is wiry and slippery.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi, Phlegm and Blood stagnation

TREATMENT:

Promote Qi and Blood circulation and expel phlegm

FORMULA:

Xiao Lou Wan and Xue Fu Zhu Yu Tang modification

Hao Zao and Kun Bu dissolve phlegm nodules at the surface. Fu Hai Shi scours away nodules. Chao (Fry) Bai Jie Ji is warm and strong at dissolving phlegm nodules. Gua Lou opens the Lung to benefit the flow of metal element Qi.

He took twelve bags for twelve days after which the nodule is softer and now the size of 1/2 an egg. He still has vertigo, shortness of breath and fullness and pain the chest. 6g of Hong Hua and

12g of Dan Shen were added to the above formula. After taking 10 bags of the modified formula, his chest pain reduced and he is no longer experiences vertigo. After 60 bags over the course of 2 months, the nodule disappeared and he has significantly less chest pain.

7. Breast nodule, Case B

A 20 year old female has a duck egg sized non-cancerous breast nodule. It is soft and painful, especially before menstruation. Her tongue is pale red with a white coating and her pulse is small and wiry.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and Phlegm stagnation.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Regulate Qi and dissolve Phlegm.

FORMULA:

Xiao Lou Wan modification

1. Chuan Shan Jia penetrates through blood and phlegm stagnation. Qian Xie clears toxins and expels wind phlegm stagnation.

RESOLUTION:

She took six bags for six days and her nodule shrank to the size of an egg. Her pulse remained small and rapid. 9g of Zi Cao Ci and 9g of Huan Yao Zi (Dioscorea Bulbifera Tuber) were added to the above formula. She took a total of 36 bags after which her nodule completely dissolved.

8. Thyroid cyst

A 26 year old female found a cyst 3cm in diameter on her thyroid after having a sore throat and cough. She also experienced breast pain, distention in the lower abdomen, hot flashes, low back pain before and during menstruation and decreased blood flow during menstruation. Her tongue was red with a thin yellow coating and her pulse was small and wiry.

DIAGNOSIS:

Damp heat
 Qi, Phlegm and Blood stagnation
 Qi and Yin deficiency
 Yin deficiency heat

TREATMENT PLAN:

Regulate Qi
 Dissolve Phlegm
 Clear deficiency heat

FORMULA:

Xiao Lou Wan modification

She also has low appetite, sweats easily and has loose stools. Her tongue has toothmarks and is pale. Her pulse is small, slippery and weak. The patient notes that she has a three year old child.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and Blood deficiency

TREATMENT PLAN:

Strengthen Spleen Qi and Liver blood
Smoothe Liver.

Ba Zhen Tang modified:

She also experiences pain and fullness in the ribs and breast, headache, irritability, dry mouth and excessive dreams. Her tongue is red with a dry coating and a small and wiry pulse.

DIAGNOSIS:

Liver Qi stagnation with Kidney Yin deficiency

TREATMENT:

Regulate the Liver and lubricate the Yin

Dan Zhi Xiao Yao San modification

She was given the Western diagnosis of lupus and was treated with hormones and antibiotics. There was no change in the condition after this course of medication. She also has vertigo, fullness of the

chest, numbness in the extremities, fatigue and low appetite. Her tongue has purple dots on the sides and her pulse is deep, small and choppy.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and Jing deficiency with Qi and Blood stagnation.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Promote blood circulation and strengthen Qi and Jing.

FORMULA: Tong Qiao Huo Xue Tang modification

A 42 year old female has been getting treatment with herbal medicine for menorrhagia with no effect. Menorrhagia is abnormally heavy bleeding during menstruation. She easily gains weight and is overweight. Her tongue has a white coating and her pulse is slippery.

DIAGNOSIS:

Qi and Phlegm stagnation.

TREATMENT PLAN:

Regulate Qi and dissolve Phlegm.

FORMULA: San Zi Yang Qing Tang

Her pulse was slippery and weak.

Spleen Qi and Kidney Yang deficiency

She is being hydrated with an IV drip every day and herbal medication appears to have no effect. Her tongue is pale red with a dry white coating and her pulse is slippery, floating and weak.

DIAGNOSIS:

Disharmony of the Stomach, Spleen, Liver and Kidney

TREATMENT PLAN:

Stabilize and descend Stomach Qi downwards.

Harmonize the Spleen and Liver.

FORMULA:

Wu Wei Zi Tang modification

She was able to carry the pregnancy to term and had a healthy baby.

15. Belching during menstruation.

A 43 year old female is suffering from constant belching three days before and during menstruation. The only thing that seems to help is if she continues talking after eating. She has been using Xiao Yao San for fourteen years which reduced the symptoms. She came in with irritability, an upset Stomach and fullness of the chest and ribs. She explained that three days prior to the start of her menses, she has frequent belching, a pale face, fatigue, low appetite, cold extremities and insomnia. She experiences excessive bleeding when her menses begins. Her tongue is pale with a red tip and toothmarks. Her pulse is deep and small.

DIAGNOSIS:

- Qi, Blood and Yin deficiency
- Liver and Stomach not harmonizing
- Spleen and Kidney Qi deficiency

TREATMENT PLAN:

Strengthen Spleen Qi
Calm the Heart and Liver

Gui Pi Tang modification

16. Vaginal Flatulence

A 34 year old patient is complains frequent vaginal flatulence of approximately ten times per day. She has been suffering from Stomach and uterus prolapse for a few years. She is skinny, fatigued, has loose stool with dull Stomach pain and has leukorrhea with a clear, thin discharge. Her menses is light. Her tongue is pale with a thin, white coating and her pulse is deep and weak.

Vaginal flatulence is the expulsion air from the vagina which is most common after intercourse, stretching, and exercise. Although the sound is similar to that of flatulence from the anus, there is usually no odor or waste gases emitted. However, a colovaginal fistula is indicated if a strong fecal odor is present during vaginal flatulence. In this patient, there is no fecal odor and the vaginal flatulence is related to organ prolapse and not a colovaginal fistula.

DIAGNOSIS:

- Spleen Qi deficiency
- Qi prolapse

TREATMENT PLAN:

Strengthen the Spleen Qi and lift the Qi upwards

Shen Ling Bai Zhu San modification
